Let's all look out for birds

The birds and wildlife around us are facing many challenges due to the nature and climate emergency and they're counting on us to help them.

Big Garden Birdwatch is the UK's largest annual citizen science wildlife survey, where you get to spend an enjoyable hour with nature in order to help us create an up-to-date picture of how our much-loved UK birds are faring.

It's free and it's easy to take part. So connect with nature this January and look out for the birds on your patch because they are counting on nature-lovers like you.

How to record your results

- Count the birds for one hour in your garden, from your balcony or local park **between 24 and 26 January 2025**.
- Record the total for each bird in the boxes on the chart overleaf.
- Count the most birds of a particular species you see at any one time.
So, if you see a group of eight Starlings, but later see six together, please write down eight as your final count.
- If you don't see any of the birds on the chart, record '0' as your final count – it's important for us to know which birds are 'no shows'.
- Only include birds that land, not those flying over.
- Even if you saw nothing make sure you tell us – it still counts.
